**Sub.: URGENT & IMPORTANT :- Request for Clarity on whether RFID Tag for E-way Bill System will be different or same as Fastag issued by NHAI.**

**Respected Sir**

All India Motor Transport Congress (AIMTC) is an apex body of Transporters - (both Cargo and Passenger) serving the industry from last 81 years, representing approx. 93 laes Truckers, Transporters and approx. 50 laes Bus, Tourist Taxi and Maxi Cab Operators of India. It is an umbrella body of covering over 3500 Taluka, Distt., State level Federations & Transport Associations pan India. We may mention here that the almost all associations, unions, major transport co.'s and more than 15 crore people are directly and indirectly associated with AIMTC.

You are kindly aware that the Uttar Pradesh Government has made it mandatory for vehicles operating in the state to use the radio frequency identification device (RFID) tag along with e-way bill from November 1, 2018.

As per the notification issued by the State Government, before transportation of such goods in the territory of Uttar Pradesh, vehicles shall obtain an RFID tag and get the said tag embedded on windscreen of the conveyance carrying such goods and get it mapped to the e-way bill system.


During our earlier meetings with Finance Ministry, MoRTH and NHAI it was given to understand that the current RFID Tags used by NHAI for Tolling purpose will suffice for mapping of E-way Bills and one RFID Tag will suffice for all purposes.

The current notification by Uttar Pradesh Government mandating RFID Tag to be mapped to the E-way Bill System from November 1, 2018, is unclear on whether the RFID tag will be the same or a separate one issued by the State Government will have to be affixed on the windscreens of the transport vehicles.

If every state will come up with its own RFID Tag, it will become a cumbersome process. Even the GSTN, MoRTH or NHAI is unable to provide any clarity on this issue.

As a nodal body, we have to apprise and create awareness among our members to abide by statutory requirement; therefore, it is requested for a prompt clarification on the above from your august office.
